Launched in 2007 with the support of the European Commission, MEDREG is the Association of Mediterranean Energy Regulators gathering 24 Members. MEDREG's main mission is to foster energy cooperation among Mediterranean countries. Building upon the experience of its members, it works on improving the regulation of gas and electricity markets. In particular, it promotes the development of cross-border solidarity through interconnection development and a greater legal harmonization in the Euro-Mediterranean region. One of its current challenges is to develop regional initiatives within the Mediterranean area, with the objective of boosting exchanges and overcoming political difficulties.

MEDREG focuses on initiatives of common interest in key areas such as infrastructure investment, by improving the investment climate through the development of institutional capacities and appropriate reforms.
